Completed OSHA Construction Industry Outreach Training program and PA Department of Transportation Flagger training

Serve as deacon of the Latina Church in Graterford, Completed various Christian ministry courses and on March 30, 2011 became an ordained minister and thereafter on September 29, 2016, obtained a Doctor in Divinity.

I have been volunteering and working as a Palliative/Hospice Care provider since August 3, 2010, assisting terminally-ill residents pass on as comfortable as possible and regularly helping the medical staff with other residents within the infirmary with their medical care.

I am and have been a member of the Latin American Cultural Exchange Organization (LACEO) since 2003, as well as the United Community Action Network (U-CAN), and a co-founder of Community Forgiveness and Restoration (CFR), helping to facilitate and interpret for the Hispanic members, as well as interpreting and co-facilitating for our Latin residents with a weekly Commutation Workshop. Through these organizations, I have been able to be a Peer Mentor, and contribute to worthy community causes such as participate in Children's Scholarship Fundraisers.
